This session will provide a review of the law on the admissibility of and discovery related to expert and opinion testimony. In addition, it will provide practical advice for identifying and retaining the right expert, ethically working with experts and deposing your opponent's experts. Topics and ethical questions to be explored will include:

- The ethical limits on dictating an expert witness' opinions.
- How providing expert witnesses with documents and information that paint a one-sided and/or incomplete story of the facts is unethical.
- The ethics of using an expert that does not meet the Daubert/Robinson requirements.
- The unethical use of an expert witness to tell the jury what the law is, supplanting the role of the judge.
